## Teaching and Learning Let's Reflect – Key Person



It is a statutory requirement to assign each child a key person. The role of the key person is to make the child feel known, understood, cared about and safe. A triangle of trust is to be established, to ensure that the child and their family's needs are met. Through building meaningful relationships, key persons are responsible for leading on the care and learning of their key children, working with others to provide provision that enables the child to reach their full potential.

"The key person must help ensure that every child's learning and care is tailored to meet their individual needs".
